

# REESE COMMUNITY PARK

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Any group may use certain areas within the Park property to the exclusion of other people by making application and being granted a permit by the Clerk's Office in the Municipal Building.
  - a. Applications for a permit for reserved Park space shall be made upon forms available at the Village Clerk's Office.
  - b. Each application shall be accompanied by a \$50.00 reservation fee.
  - c. Application should be made at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the requested reservation.
  - d. Applications will be considered on a first come, first served basis.
  - e. Any exception to Park Rules and Regulations must have prior written approval from the Park Department.
2. Any person or organization to whom the written permit is issued by the Park Department shall exhibit such permit upon request.
3. Any person or organization to whom a written permit is issued shall be subject to the provisions of these regulations and shall be held liable for any personal or property loss, damage, or injury caused by their violation.
4. The Reese Community Park shall be closed to the public each evening at 11:00 p.m. and continue closed during the remaining night hours unless special permits are issued to alter these times.
5. The Reese Community Park may be used for athletic contests and games specifically planned for in the Park. Games that may endanger visitors to the park or those not taking part in the activity will not be allowed. Examples: hitting golf balls, using firearms, use of archery equipment, etc.

6. In the Reese Community Park, no person shall:
- a. Cut, mutilate, destroy, remove, or carry away any plant, shrub, tree or wildlife, nor remove nor dig any turf or earth; nor shall any person attach any signs, posters, chain, rope, or cable or any other article to trees, shrubs, buildings or fences.
  - b. Deface, mar, damage, or destroy any structure, fence, playground equipment or any other Park property; nor shall any person remove or carry away any signs, tables, benches, equipment or other physical features.
  - c. Enter into any building area or place when such area or place is not open to the general public; nor shall any person erect, build or maintain any structure or establish himself in a temporary lodging of any kind.
  - d. Build an open fire except in receptacles intended for that purpose.
  - e. Carry in or dispose of any home rubbish, garbage, or refuse: nor shall any person dispose of any rubbish or litter in Park, except in receptacles provided for that purpose.
  - f. Conduct himself in a disorderly manner nor use profane or obscene language; nor shall any intoxicated person be allowed in any such public place.
  - g. Fail to keep any animal owned by or entrusted to him under control at all times on a leash not exceeding eight (8) feet in length. Any damage caused by said animal is the responsibility of its owner or handler.
  - h. Throw, toss, discard any bricks, bottles, stones, or cans or other debris in any part of the Park.
  - i. Play golf, baseball, softball, or football, unless in areas designated for that purpose.
  - j. Produce electrically amplified sounds at a volume which would threaten the comfort of others.
  - k. Use Park areas for any use which is not recreational or educational.
